### "What Is The Purpose of The Lectureship?"

Recently a student asked me to explain the purpose of the Florida School of Preaching Lectureship. After doing some additional reflection on this question and in view of the annual lectureship let us consider some reasons for having a lectureship.

#### Edification

The occasion provides an excellent opportunity for mutual edification. Students and staff are strengthened by this event. Those attending are built up in the most holy faith. Congregations participating will be encouraged and strengthened. This alone would be sufficient grounds for having the lectures.

#### Communication

Each year those attending learn much about the *Florida School of Preaching*. While attending the lectureship individuals visit with student and staff and much is learned regarding the work of the school. Those attending can assist students and staff in knowing what is transpiring in the church where they worship and work. When these things are known the needs of all concerned may be better addressed.

#### **Address Questions**

During the lectureship there is provided time and opportunity for questions. With the excellent staff of speakers much help is available for inquiring souls. This provides a unique opportunity to have subjects raised and considered. With faithful men offering suggestions we are better

able to return our local congregations and address questions that may be vexing us on the home front.

#### **Focusing Issues**

Without contact with faithful brethren we may not know that a given issue is a potential problem for the congregations of the brotherhood. During the lectureship attention is directed to areas that concern brethren on more than a single congregation basis. The Bible abounds in warnings from faithful brethren regarding wolves in sheep clothing (Matt. 7:15); of those who come in with less than honorable motives (Jude 3ff.; II Peter 3:14-18; 2:1-2ff.).

Being alert to particular hobbies and false teachings will enable elders to better oversee the congregations where they serve. Informed preachers that have the courage to preach the truth will be better prepared to teach what is profitable to those who listen to them on a weekly basis.

This has motivated preachers to come at their own expense to attend the lectures.

#### Fellowship

The lectureship affords individuals an opportunity to see old friends and to acquire new ones. Most preachers could name a person(s) with whom a close association developed during their attendance at a lectureship.

When the truth is the common denominator that binds souls together the fellowship is wonderful.

Isolated from fellow sol-

diers of the cross may tempt us to become weary in well doing. A few days of fellowship with the faithful can do great things for our spiritual well being.

#### Challenge

When the lectureship is over each will return with renewed challenges. Challenges that will urge individuals to do more for the glory of God and the salvation of souls. Challenges that prompt us to greater faithfulness and loyalty to Him that loved us and is calling upon us to place His will and ways above all others.

These suggestions are sufficient to challenge us to prepare our schedule that we might attend the *Florida School of Preaching Lectureship*. For additional information write or call the school for a brochure.

The above Congregations had representatives meet at the *Florida School of Preaching* for an evening of fellowship. Winfred Clark was the speaker for this occasion. He declared that today: (1) Sin is minimized; (2) Christ is humanized; (3) the Bible is liberalized; (4) the church is criticized, and (5) spirituality is deemphasized. This means that there is a great need for the work the school and its supporters are doing.

In providing a textual analysis of Luke 19:28–38 brother Clark emphasized (1) the leadership of Christ; (2) that Christ asks for and deserves our very best; (3) that those whom Christ sent, went; (4) that Christ has need of us in his plan for reaching men with the gospel; (5) that those who journey with Christ into the city laid what they had before him, observing that all of us can have a part in the grand and noble plan of the Master.

The Florida School of Preaching appreciates the help provided by faithful brethren everywhere. On this occasion we were honored to have brethren from the State of Florida to be together and know of our potential for the future and to express appreciation to the many loyal supporters from our state.
