The Ministry of Singing

"Ah, the sweet ministry of song." "All nature sings and around me rings the music of the sphere." Recently someone asked, "Why can't we have a quartet number or a solo at the worship hour? Why is it right to have choruses and quartets sing at other times and wrong for them to sing at the worship hour? Choruses and quartets give scriptural teaching, encouragement, pleasure, and uplift us spiritually."

The answer to the question must be understood in light of our purpose in assembling. We assemble for congregational worship. We are instructed in the Bible to sing: "Speaking to yourselves in psalms hymns and spiritual songs. singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord" (Eph. 5:19). Furthermore, we are to teach and admonish one another: "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom: teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord" (Col. 3:16). These passages declare a reciprocal benefit in singing at the worship hour. Everyone who shares in this reciprocal benefit must participate in the

singing. This reciprocal benefit is lacking in quartet, chorus, and solo numbers. If I do not sing in the worship hour, then I do not worship in song. The solos, quartets, and choruses may teach, admonish and be pleasant to our ears but they lack the reciprocal benefits that are necessary to meet the requirements of Colossians 3:16 and Ephesians 5:19.



Why can't we have a quartet number or a solo at the worship hour? Why is it right to have choruses and quartets sing at other times and wrong for them to sing at the worship hour?

Therefore, they do not meet requirements for congregational worship.

The question then arises: How about songs in which one group sings and the other rest? Generally, it is not in propriety to sing songs of this nature at the worship hour because (1) many people do not understand what part they are to sing and therefore do not sing, and (2) these songs, by their very nature, are not generally suited for mutual edifica-The congregation must be familiar with the songs we sing if we are to have mutual edification in singing. Using the words of Christ, we are to teach and admonish one another. singing songs and hymns that move the heart more
