# "BEHOLD THE PATTERN" A Review



The Goebel name Music is not all that well known in our part of the country and in a way that is a shame. This writer has known him for nearly twenty years. Our first association was when he lived in Texarkana, TX., working with the Walnut Street Congregation, and brother Music was preaching for the Pleasant Valley congregation in Little Rock. Arkansas. During the time we lived in Texarkana, he preached in two gospel meetings for us. To say that he is a great student of the Bible and loves the inspired revelation of God to man is certainly true. He has a brilliant memory and not very many among us today has a greater command of the scriptures than he. There is one thing I would say about him and that is that he is faithful in every respect.


