The folks promoting this publication are determined to changing the present status of the Lord's people into a religious body that will accept most any and all religious confusion. When these folks arrive at the destination Mr. Cope is leading them it will be, in his words, unsafe and unsure. His concluding paragraph says: ""Where is this leading us?" I have to say, 'I'm not sure.' Then when they ask, 'Is it safe?' I have to respond, 'Probably not!'"

In the article there is a quote that should disturb any thinking person. Mr. Cope asserts in all capital letters circled in the center of the

According to such assertions we should stop opposing any religious confusion. No person respecting the Bible can accept such nonsense. Little wonder Mr. Cope is unsure where he is going or of the safety of his fellow travelers. Jesus has no problem forecasting their destination

Perverted Grace Will Not Save

These folks have confusing views on grace and salvation. Consider some assertions by Mr. Cope. "They [Mr. Cope's folks] place the emphasis of salvation on what God has already done, believing that we are saved in spite of our failures because of what God has accomplished at the cross. They believe that if he grants grace with moral imperfections, he'll surely offer grace for doctrinal imperfections as well. . . . We have all fallen short and are saved by God's faithfulness." Is Paul wrong? What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin, that grace may abound? God forbid. How shall we, that are dead to sin, live any longer therein? (Rom. 6:1-2). Christ is become of no effect unto you, whosoever of you are justified by the law; ye are fallen from grace (Gal.

5:4).

Questions

(1) If we are saved by what God has already done at the cross why will not all men be saved? (2) Did God only love some? (3) Did Christ die for all? (4) If God grants grace with moral imperfections will all immoral persons be saved? (5) If God grants grace with moral imperfections then why does God command all men every where to repent (Acts 17:30)? (6) If God grants grace with doctrinal imperfections then why did Jesus say that we have to be right about him (John 8:24)? (7) Should it be asserted that we must be right about some doctrinal items but not about others—Who decides which doctrinal items we have to be right about and which doctrinal items we do not have to be right about? (8) How may I know that those telling me some doctrine must be true and some may be false are telling me the truth? (9) Is the doctrine that "God grants grace with doctrinal imperfections" itself doctrinally imperfect? If not why is it different? (10) How may we know that a given teaching is doctrinally imperfect? (11) If we may know that a belief is doctrinally imperfect must we not at the same time know what is sound doctrine? (12) If we may know the difference between perfect doctrine and imperfect doctrine should we be satisfied with imperfect doctrine? (13) What did the Lord mean when he said, If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed; And ye shall know the

truth, and the truth shall make you free (John 8:31-32)? (14) Should we follow folks that are not sure where they are going? (15) Will the world be greatly blessed if we become a religious people who are not sure where we are going, and when we arrive at our destination it is probably not safe? (16) How is the doctrine championed by these folks different from the skeptical world? [Editor.]

A Crucial Appeal

Dear brethren.

We know that you are interested in the *Florida School of Preaching*. Without your loyal support we would be unable to do our best to train preachers. We want you to know how important you are to our labor in the Lord.

With the present enrollment we must raise \$5,000. each month for student support alone. No student is fully supported by the school. Each student must help himself by raising some of his support. We are using part-time staff in teaching. The only full-time staff are the director of the school and the secretary.

The Florida School of Preaching provides unique opportunities for those wishing to receive special training enabling them to be faithful servants of the Lord. (1) We have students that have earned four year college degrees but have decided to preach. With us they may gain a firm foundation that will enable them to preach and teach the gospel. (2) We have former students who have gone on to continue their education at Freed-Hardeman University and other schools of higher learning. They often write us thanking us for the foundation they received here and stating how it has helped them in their continued education. (3) We have men that have come from Denominationalism training and backgrounds, men who need to study in a concentrated way that they might understand more accurately the Word of God. Some of these would not be able to pay for the training in schools operated by our brethren. (4) We are meeting the needs of some that do not have the formal training to enter colleges and universities. However, they may study here and build on that foundation and perhaps later continue their formal education. (5) There are elders in our area who have attended the school and congregations have better leadership.

Preachers and elders are not born. They must be trained. If the church is to survive and take the message of the gospel to the world we must train preachers (II Tim. 2:2). We must make an investment in encouraging and preparing men to teach and edity souls. Men in training have a right to be assisted. What kind of armed forces would the country have if it were indifferent to seeking and training men to serve? Please help us to recruit men and to provide them the basic training we all know they need.

We know many are making plans for next year's budgets. Please make a place for men preparing to preach the gospel.
