## Personal Reflections

### Surveying Churches, Preachers, Schools and Orphan Homes

For some years now *Where the Saints Meet* has been published. It enables people to know something of the basic doctrinal position(s) of a local congregation. While not perfect it does provide some assistance. In the preface the publishers write: "It is our prayer that this directory will provide Christians who travel or are moving with a means of contacting congregations in other areas." In the 1991 edition there are listed more than two dozen positions that help to identify the particular doctrinal stand of congregations. This information was said to have come from "those who completed and returned the

over fifteen thousand questionnaires that were distributed."

#### **Preacher Surveys**

Do you think value could come from the publication of preachers doctrinal positions? What should be the questions asked to have an idea of the position occupied by preachers? Who should send out a questionnaire to local preachers and publish what is known about what given men hold and teach? Would this be helpful to elders and congregations when looking for a preacher on the move? Do you think

preachers would fill out a questionnaire? Do you feel preachers would be honest in what they state for public consumption about their beliefs? Do you think some preachers would have a problem harmonizing their published answers with their practices? Do we hear of some preachers who are not aware of changing (or so they say) while the brotherhood and denominational bodies are well aware of their drastic changes?

#### **College Surveys**

Do you think that questions posed for publication from colleges funded by brethren might prove helpful? Do

you think they would be honest with the questionnaire? Do you feel that the administration and faculty would admit changes from original positions occupied? Do you think some would deny changes had taken place since members of the faculty and publications from their staff and printing presses publish materials clearly denying what was once taught and believed by past administrators and faculty members?

**Orphan Home Surveys**

Should a questionnaire be included for orphan homes that seek funds from brethren? Do you think one set of answers would be provided by fund raisers while visiting to raise funds and a totally different set of answers would come from the speakers on special workshops under the same parties? Do you think some might be disturbed to answer questions?

**Conclusion**

Why would a preacher be ashamed to let all know his doctrinal convictions and actions? Why would a school administrator or faculty member not want class notes and lectures to be known by all? Is honesty a Christian virtue? Has misrepresentation of facts become an essential art for

hiding the true convictions and actions of some? Do you think the things under consideration here are worthy of personal evaluation? Should individuals and congregations have no concern for what their brethren think or believe? Should any and/or all actions done in the name of a "Christian work" be supported?
