Looking Ahead 95 Curriculum To Include Computer Class

In times past we have offered a class to acquaint the students with the potential of the computer in the role of preaching. Our catalogue lists the class as "Computers and Churches." It was offered in the summer session and well received by all. Our plans are now under way to make this a part of the regular course work of the school. At the present time there are two students using laptop computers to take notes in classes. There are Bible programs, word processing programs (including spell checking, grammatical aids, dictionaries, etc.) and bookkeeping tools available Preachers churches need to know that they may greatly enhance their effectiveness as preachers and churches. At the present time we do our school catalogue on our system. This saves us over \$200.00 per year on type

setting the book alone in addition to having the copies printed. When we had them printed we had to estimate the amount of copies we would need and this always varied. If we did not overprint we would end the year without enough to correctly represent the



school to those requesting that information. When we overprinted, then we had old catalogues that were of no value. Now we can print only what we need when we need them. This saves us funds. It is the same way with our tape

catalogues and *Harvester's* production.

Without our computer it would be virtually impossible to have the Harvester's mailed each month. It would take Rachel (our secretary) most of her time each month to type and address the mailing labels. Our computer at school is not an optional item; it has become an essential item. We are confident it would be so to preachers and churches who understand their value. Hence our desire to better equip or train our students by exposing the potential them to computers provide.

Target Fall 95

Our plans are underway to have all systems go for Fall Classes in 1995. The class will meet each week and we hope to devote part of the time to lecture and part with hands on experience, using the computer to do what the week's lecture has presented. In other words a part of the class will be a lab.

system? Would you donate it the class? Computer products and programs change rapidly. Many have purchased new 486 machines or Pentium machines and have a second older 386 machine that they are not using. It is possible to donate this to the school and receive a tax credit while at the same time assisting the students with a computer for their lab work (hands on experience). We have a party that has pledged to purchase the school a new computer for Rachel to use in the office enabling us to use our current computer for one lab system.

Perhaps you have a



printer that you are not using. This too will be needed by the students if they are to

fully understand and appreciate the potential of computers.

There will also be the necessity of having a typing chair and desk for each computer system. Do you have such that could be given to the lab? If you do not have these

items perhaps you would be willing to help secure them for the lab? We would appreciate hearing from you as soon as possible that we might have these items to make most effective our teaching efforts.

With twenty (20) or more students in the class we will need to have lab space and computers to accommodate them. It will not be necessary to have a computer for each student. Some already have a computer and can assist those who do not with the class projects and do their assign-

ments on their home system. The lab will be of greatest value to those not having compute errorsystems and



needing some hands on experience to better appreciate their potential.






