Her Influence Lives On A Tribute To Dorothy Bise

The Bible makes us aware of the power of influence. There are those who affected others in a negative way and those who affected people in a positive way. Jeroboam and David come to mind. Abel affects us today when we read of his devotion to God. "By faith Abel offered unto God a more excellent sacrifice than Cain, through which he had witness borne to him that he was righteous, God bearing witness in respect of his gifts: and through it he being dead yet speaketh" (Heb. 11:4, ASV). The Bible teaches us that the acts of good people live on and have a positive influence as well as great reward. "And I heard the voice from heaven saying, Write, Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from henceforth: yea, saith the Spirit, that they may rest from their labors; for their works follow with them" (Rev 14:13,

ASV).

Sister Bise was born in Pope County, Southern Illinois in 1906. She died November 16, 1994. She was a graduate of Southern Illinois University,

Carbondale. She was a member of the Pi Lambda Theta Honor Society. She married Lawrence Bise, April 1931. She converted her husband who later served as an elder of Cherry Street Church of Christ in Mt Vernon, Illinois. He died in 1985.

Sister Bise was a school teacher for forty-four (44) years. Because of her love for children and education she used her summer months to tutor slow children. She used her own money to clothe needy children in her classroom. She was known for her hospitality. It was common for ministers to be the recipients of her Christian supported hospitality. She Christian colleges and was a faithful supporter of the Florida School of Preaching. She moved to Florida in 1976 and was active in personal work in many ways until her activities were curtailed by disability in 1985. It was not uncommon for sister Bise to assist students in the School of Preaching and she often continued helping some following their graduation. She was generous and truly interested in promoting the cause of her Lord.

Sister Bise is survived by two children. Dottie Bise Gutzler, retired RN, and wife of Ray Gutzler, a deacon of the South Florida Avenue Church of Christ, Lakeland, Florida. She has a Son, Dr. Stanley Lawrence Bise, MD of Crossville, Tennessee.

The family wanted something be done in her memory as a lasting memorial. As we plan for our new computer class in 1995 there are a number of items that will make this part of our training preachers more effective. We need computers and a printer. In sister Bise's memory we will be securing a Color Ink Jet Printer to be used by the office and the class. It will enable us to print documents in regular black and white format and also enable us to do some color printing for transparencies for over head projectors. This will make more graphic maps and materials for class room presentations. It will enable us to print on card stock paper for various applications and perhaps have some color on the cover of our catalogues that are prepared in house for the school.

We are grateful for the long years of support of sister Bise and will think of her often as we use the printer equipment which will be to her honor and memory. In memory of sister Bise the printer will have a plate


