Another letter is as follows:

Dear Sirs:

Just wish I could be present for lectureship; since I can't, the book will be the next best thing. Thank you ever so much.

We also received and make reply to the following letter from Zambia.

December 15, 1995

Florida School of Preaching Dear Mr. Stearsman:

Greeting from Zambia!! I hope that you are doing well in your work. Having preached the gospel for the past seventeen years in my country, I have diagnosed deficiency in the evangelization of Zambia. We desperately need schools of biblical studies in our country in order for us to reach a maturity. desired 1 am convinced that the church would do well, in terms of growth, if we had schools, such as yours, which would develop and produce capable local men to faithfully minister the gospel to their people.

It is amazing that all of my biblical training has come from schools outside Zambia. and we have many more Zambians who yearn for similar training. Financial constraints have been highly prohibitive, thus hampering their aspirations and desires to train and adequately qualified to preach the gospel of Christ.

Therefore, on behalf of my people, I would like to appeal to you to assist us in our efforts to establish a school such as yours within our borders. I understand that you had helped brethren in ... to begin a school of preaching there. I would like to know what it would take to set up a school of such magnitude. I have written to my sponsoring congregation for permission to visit your school on a factfinding mission sometime next year. Would that be alright with you?

We replied in part as follows:

January 2, 1996

Dear brother Sokontella,

it was good to hear from you and to know of your work for the Lord in Zambia. I can well understand your assessment of the problem of developing the church in your own country and in the world. I have long been persuaded, in fact it is why I am in the work that I am in, that you can evangelize people no faster than you can develop local congregations. In view of this develop fact you can congregations no faster than you have men to assist with teaching and edification. This means that a preacher or someone doing the work of a preacher is an absolute essential. I am convinced that the study of the life of Paul and the epistles he wrote will establish this beyond successful contradiction. In fact this is one of the reasons that we developed the life of Paul class taught in school here. If men are to understand their duties as a preacher they must understand Paul and his work. God chose him for such a task (Acts 9:15).

church The must understand her duty to train men to serve as preachers. We cannot expect the world or secular universities to train men to be a preacher. How could it? We cannot expect many of the schools that are operating with the major emphasis on secular education to train men to preach. Some men doing the teaching in these schools are not as convinced as they should be of the necessity of preaching and neither are they informed as they should be of what preaching is all about. Being schooled in denominational theology and methodology and then trying to incorporate this into practice among faithful people of God will result in confusion to all.

We have talked with some brethren interested in starting a school in Haiti and have attempted to show them what we are doing here with older men who have served as preachers and/or elders to help them understand the duty sacred privilege preaching. I am the only full time teacher in our school. This enables us to draw on the strength of others to meet particular needs in the total training. It is better that the students have exposure to more than one person in their training. They do not need to be the clones of me or anyone else. They need to bring out their best potential for the work they are assigned and pledged to be engaged.

If we can explain further our work, I will be happy to do so. Should you be able to come to the States this year, I will take time to go into detail about our program and the underlying philosophy behind it....

The church is very weak in some parts of the States today. Many are closer to the Christian Church than
