In the letter above it should be evident that the need for preacher training is an absolute necessity. The Florida School of Preaching tries to assist former students as well as others who have needs such as this brother has stated. Due to the nature of these divisive doctrines of men we believe it would be helpful to have a response in print to this letter that others might be helped when confronted by false positions.

In the coming issues of the Harvesters as we have time and space, we propose to write replies to the issues of the "Anti" positions.

It should be understood that only God can bind and loose in matters of religious doctrine (Matt. 16:19; 2 John 9-11). Likewise, it must be understood that there are areas of expedient judgment that God has authorized. The Bible is just as specific in condemning man making laws for God as it does man breaking the laws that God

has made (1 Tim. 4:1-5; Acts 15:1, 22-29; Matt. 15:9).

In considering the above letter, we have a man making laws for God. Paul states to Timothy that man made laws for God in two areas that were causing them immediate problems—forbidding to marry and commanding to abstain from meats (I Tim. 4:1-5). Paul also states that in teaching and accepting this is to depart from the faith. Did a person have to marry? No. This was a matter of liberty. Did a person have to eat meat? No. This too was a matter of liberty.

In Antioch men were teaching that in order to be saved Gentiles had to be circumcised after the manner of the Law of Moses. There was great confusion over the issue. Leaders of the church met in Jerusalem and came to one mind in this issue. Gentiles did not have to become Jews before they were accepted as Christians. There was no such law given (Acts 15:1, 22–29). To make such laws for God is sinful and must be opposed.

The Bible is very clear in its restrictions and liberties. People must rightly divide the teaching of the Bible (2 Tim. 2:15). People must not go beyond what God has authorized (2 John 9–11). People must not take it upon themselves to restrict where God has left us free.

Are you able to help people make these distinctions? Could you help the brother who wrote the letter cited above? Have you had people try to teach some of the positions that he is facing?

We must not be alarmed when difficulties arise among us. There always have been such problems. Paul states this very clearly in First Corinthians 11:19. "For there must be also factions among you, that they that are approved may be made manifest among you."

We must place God and His Word above the words of men. The kingdom of God cannot be developed with defective materials. God will test the building and each of us working to expand the borders of the kingdom does not have the liberty to work with wood, hay, or stubble. The church must be built with the best of products. God promises to test the building and to do so with fire.

Only persons of genuine character will stand the tests. will face the issues of life, in favor with God. We may temporal suffer loss. Let all take how heed they build (1 Cor. 3:10-17).
