Recruiting Students

Preachers are not born. Preachers must be encouraged, motivated, and trained in the truth of the gospel. Wisdom is needed in the task before us. We must preach the truth in love (Eph. 4:15).

Our faculty and administration is made up of elders and preachers. Some of the Board of Directors have graduated from the Florida School of Preaching. Some are either serving as full-preachers or elders of the Lord's church. We know this provides us with a unique opportunity to instill truths and wisdom into the lives of our students.


The state is not designated by God to train preachers. The home plays a limited role in training men to preach. The primary unit in society to train preachers is the Lord's church. Only the church, grounded in the faith, may train faithful men to teach others (2 Tim. 2:2).

We are not opposed to colleges offering higher academic training. Many of us have profited from our studies in them. However, we are convinced that the Florida School of Preaching can and does provide preacher training that is more concentrated in developing preachers than schools of higher academic standing. Why is this true? In a regular school students must meet the standards of the Association of colleges and schools under which these schools offer degrees. In this sense, these schools are not at liberty to meet the needs of all

men wanting to prepare to preach the gospel. Some could not afford these schools, others could not enter because they would be unable to meet entrance requirements. Some men decide to preach after finishing college. To enroll in degree offering schools to take all classes would not be practical.


Jesus chose men of maturity to preach the gospel. Some of these were professional people. We must not think of preacher training as something only for youth. We must not make preacher training so difficult that we kill the desire before it can be matured. We must keep in mind the goal to train preachers. We are not in competition with other like works. We are not opposed to schools of higher learning. We are dedicated to training men to preach.


Fritz Acquissa


Lauzama Baker





TRAINING PREACHERS SINCE 1969




Justin Gerhardt
