He Cares

[This editorial was given to us by Glenn Sheumaker, one of the preachers for the South Florida Avenue Church of Christ in Lakeland, Florida. We know it will be of interest to those who support the school and enjoy knowing of the fruits of our labor. We learned also that another of our May, 1999, graduates, Nate Stewart, who now preaches full-time for a congregation near Jacksonville, Florida, baptized four people on August 22, 1999. Editor]

He had been to a denominational training school and ordained to preach in Haiti. For economic reasons he had migrated to St. Martin and while working as a stock manager for a large supermarket, pastored a Pentecostal congregation on the island. His brother had gone to Orlando, Florida and while visiting there he met a fellow Haitian who was preaching for a Haitian congregation of the churches of Christ. "When this brother told me I was not a Christian I told him he must be crazy,' he said, as he related the story to us. "I had been preaching several years and had led others to the Lord," he continued, "but after studying two full days with my new acquaintance I realized he was correct. I wasn't a Christian. I'd never been baptized for the forgiveness of sins."

Emmanuel Charles was baptized and returned to St. Martin nervously to tell his wife

and the congregation where he preached what he had done. "My wife said, 'You did what?', When I told her I had been baptized again, only this time for the right reason and she immediately said, 'what are you going to tell the church?" First he sat out to teach her and when she understood and was baptized he told the church what they had done. An uproar ensued and he called for the brethren from Orlando to come and help him explain the newly understood truth to congregation. The first night the people all said, 'We are not coming back,' but they did. The second night they said, "We are not coming back,' but they did. The third, fourth and fifth nights were the same but ' . . . each evening for two weeks they returned to listen to the Bible being taught and they asked many questions and often left upset," he told us. After two weeks of study and answering questions seventeen were baptized. Some were unable to make the change and one man said, "I understand and know this is right but I will die in my sins because I cannot leave what I have spent my life serving.'

Our brother Emmanuel, with great joy, told two hundred people at the Caribbean Lectureship last week, 'The church of Christ is now in St. Martin.' Already he has converted sixty people and their average attendance of 100 has pushed him on to continue working among the French speaking people on that little island which is jointly owned by the French and Dutch governments. He was unaware of any tracts, books or literature in the French language and to his delight Marie-Claire is putting him in contact with the French Brotherhood. (Keynoter, July 22, 1999).

I like Labels

Often we hear brethren say: "I don't like labels! I don't think we should put people in 'pigeonholes'." May I choose to disagree? I LIKE LABELS so long as they are accurate! Label me "anti-sin"! Call me "anti-mechanical instrumental music" and I am proud to wear such! How confusing it would be when we purchase groceries if none of the cans had labels [like the ones thrown in a grocery cart and sold at a fraction of their true price]. We wouldn't know the contents. amount, or the price. I LIKE LABELS! Their titles serve well as sort of a "shorthand" to lengthy. full-bore descriptions as to what's inside--just take a look at your Wal-Mart receipt sometime.

Medicines and chemicals have warning labels cautioning against the abuse of the contents: "WARNING: May be harmful or fatal if taken orally." I LIKE I detest wanting to LABELS! purchase an item and not knowing how much I must pay for it--I appreciate the fact that some stores have little machines mounted here and there so I can electronically "scan" for the price of the item without walking to the front of the store! But I'd rather have a LABEL with the price on it!

We also need labels for the purity of the church and our spiritual well-being. "Now I beseech you, brethren, mark (i.e. note--as in scrutinize) them that are causing the divisions and occasions of stumbling, contrary to the doctrine which ye learned: and turn away from them" (Rom. 16:17). Paul goes on to call them "belly-servers, smooth-talkers and

beguilers" in the next verse. Note some Biblical labels--"Warning Labels":

all, but it often helps to know which "pigeonhole" a person occupies (e.g. Crossroader/Bostoner/ICCer). The great danger in labels is attaching the WRONG label as per objective facts for which we will all be judged: "Woe to those who call evil good, and good evil; Who put darkness for light, and light for darkness; Who put bitter for sweet, and sweet for bitter! (Isa, 5:20; cf. Jer. 8:11)! We all know that there is federal and SPIRITUAL law against false advertising, but let's not jerk all the labels off the cans because a grocery boy marked a price or the contents incorrectly now and then! Also, let's not just assume the "grocery boy" mislabeled because someone cries "foul" either--make him prove it!



Fall Semester Begins

At this writing we have nine full-time students enrolled for classes. We have three extension classes and two night classes that meet at South Florida Avenue, Tuesday and Thursday evenings.
