
Booster BanquetTo Honor Charles and Gay Hendrickson

ach year at the → Booster Banquet individuals or a congregation is selected to give special recognition for their contribution to the Florida School of Preaching. This year we have selected Charles and Gay Hendrickson from Mobile, Alabama. The late brother V. P. Black encouraged this fine couple to attend the annual lectureship at the Florida School of Preaching many years ago. Since that initial visit, unless circumstances prevented it, they have attended the annual lectures and make significant contributions toward that event and the ongoing operations of the school. Mears, June 26, 1959. Gay was born in Mobile, Alabama, and obeyed the gospel in 1954. She and

Charles and Gay were members of the Plateau church of Christ where the late V. P. Black was the minister. He credits brother Black with teaching him the values of giving that has characterized his life over the years.

2008 Lectureship Book Appendix

If all goes as previous years, according to the Lord's will, we should have our 2008 lectureship book, Do You Understand the Biblical View of Man?, ready for distribution by mid-December. Much effort and many long hours have gone into production, and everything had to be "camera ready" around October 1. Next month's Harvester will give an overview of the lectureship book concerning the speaker subjects listed on page 3. In this brief overview, we want to bring attention to the appendix of this book. Although it is short compared to the rest of the book, it is rich with Biblical truth.

Since our 1999 lectureship book, we have included an appendix. These chapters deal with topics that are relative to our overall theme, but are not part of the oral presentations. One of the most valuable features of our appendixes over the years has been the written contributions from many of our faithful Christian ladies. This year's appendix is no different.

Joyce Stearsman wrote an article, "Older Women Teach the Younger Women," based on Titus 2:3-5. She looks at God's requirements, a challenging personal inventory, what is to be taught, the woman's relationship to the man, and concludes with a queen mother's advice to her son (Pr. 31). She writes, "The younger women of our day need the advice and wisdom gained by the older women who have a lifetime of experience....If the younger heed the advice of the older and profit by it, they may avoid many problems, mistakes, heartaches, and pain that they might face in their future."

Katrina Stearsman wrote an article, "Influence Exerted by Women." In it, she examines general Biblical statements regarding a woman's influence, and she gives examples of both good and bad women found in the Old and New Testaments, from Eve (Gen. 3:1-6) to Eunice and Lois (2 Tim. 1:5; 3:14-15). She concludes, "A Christian woman's influence is far reaching. As the salt of the earth and the light of the world by covenant with God, her influence is commandeered from cradle to grave."

Amber Kenyon wrote an article, "Wives Helping Their Husbands," in which she examines practically how a wife can help her husband in the home, with their children, in his secular work, and in his work with the church. She

writes, "Among some important factors for a wife to help her husband are strong faith, flexibility, moral/spiritual support, encouragement, and letting her husband know that he is loved more than anything in this world."

Susan Stearsman wrote an article, "Lydia: Biblical Insights for Professional Women," in which she shows from Lydia's life that women can be successful professionals and still be faithful to the Lord and to promoting Christ's cause. She writes, "The spirit of humans can seek to worship God, promote his cause, and influence a world that does not know him. Lydia of Acts 16 exemplifies such a spirit."

In addition to the articles written by women, we have additional articles that deal with the Biblical view of man. Jackie Stearsman's article, "Is Eternal Punishment Justified?," examines eternal punishment in light of God's character. His thesis is stated three ways: (1) positively: "It is the case that God is just in punishing disobedient people eternally;" (2) negatively: "It is not contrary to the nature of God nor to the nature of divine justice for God to punish disobedient people eternally;" and (3) Biblically: "The Bible teaches that God will punish eternally the wicked and disobedient people who refuse his overtures of mercy and love by not repenting and obeying his will."

There are two articles that deal with homosexuality. First, George Beals wrote "Homosexuality," which looks at the current influence of it in our society, presents arguments that show all homosexual behavior is immoral (sinful), critiques some of the "pro-gay arguments," and gives some practical advice in dealing with the problem of homosexuality today. He writes, "Whether or not a physical tendency exists in the body

does not decide the morality of the corresponding behavior. What does determine the morality of human behavior? God. Where do we find God's direction? In his word."

Second, Brian Kenyon wrote "Is Homosexuality Biologically Determined?," in which he examines scientific studies that have claimed homosexuality is biologically determined, including Simon LeVay's "champion" study of the hypothalamus.

As the concluding article to our appendix, we are reprinting, with permission from the *Spiritual Sword*, Roy Deaver's 1977 review of the Warren-Flew Debate on the existence of God, along with the reprint of a 2004 article that documented the famous atheist's realization, almost thirty years later, that "A super-intelligence is the only good explanation for the origin of life and the complexity of nature."

Each year our lectureship and book are carefully planned and put together. There are only thirty-two speaking slots that can have corresponding chapters in the book. However, understanding the Biblical view of man is much broader than thirty-two slots, and it is with this in mind that the appendix exists.







