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WHAT THE HOLY SPIRIT DOES THAT THE WORD OF GOD DOES NOT

In the discussion of the work of the Holy Spirit, among faithful brethren, it is common for some to present lists that show whatever the Holy Spirit does, the word of God also does. For example, the Holy Spirit "convicts" (Jn. 16:8, NJK), and the word of God "convicts" (Titus 1:9). The conclusion is then drawn: since the Holy Spirit does what the word of God does, it is the word of God that does everything the Holy Spirit is said to do. While it is true the Holy Spirit never does anything contrary to the Godhead's will, there are some things the Bible teaches the Holy Spirit does that the word of God does not.

THE HOLY SPIRIT MAKES INTERCESSION

Likewise the Spirit also helps in our weaknesses. For we do not know what we should pray for as we ought, but the Spirit Himself makes intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered. ²⁷Now He who searches the hearts knows what the mind of the Spirit is, because He makes intercession for the saints according to the will of God. (Rom. 8:26-27)

The Christian's weaknesses include sometimes not knowing what to pray for nor how to pray for it (cf. 2 Cor. 12:6-10), but in spite of human weaknesses, the God within the Christian (Rom. 8:9-11) makes intercession for him or her to the God in heaven. "Intercession" is translated from a word (*huperentugchano*, ὑπερεντυγχάνω) that means to intercede, plead for someone. It is a picturesque word of rescue

by one who "happens on" another who is in trouble and "in his behalf" pleads with groanings that defy words to one who can help (cf. the good Samaritan). Romans 8:26 is the only verse to use this Greek word. Romans 8:34, speaking of Jesus' interceding on the Christian's behalf uses a different but similar word (from entugchano, ἐντυγχάνω, also in Rom. 8:27; Acts 25:24; Rom. 11:2; Heb. 7:25). God receives these "groanings" as acceptable prayer because they come from a human spirit wherein dwells the Holy Spirit (Rom. 8:9-11). He who searches the mind is God (cf. Jer. 17:9-10). Since God knows the Christian's mind and the Spirit's intercession on behalf of the Christian, God will give Christians the strength they need to endure the struggle until final salvation. Although the Spirit's intercession is always in accordance with God's word, the word of God is never said to intercede on behalf of the Christian in prayer!

THE HOLY SPIRIT SEALS

Now He who establishes us with you in Christ and has anointed us is God, ²²who also has sealed us and given us the Spirit in our hearts as a guarantee. (2 Cor. 1:21-22)

In Him you also trusted, after you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation; in whom also, having believed, you were sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise, ¹⁴who is the guarantee of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession, to the praise of His glory. (Eph. 1:13-14)

The word translated "sealed" (from *sphragizo*, $\sigma \varphi \rho \alpha \gamma i \zeta \omega$) can be literal in reference to sealing (Mt. 27:66; Rom. 15:28; Rev. 20:3) (this section adapted from Schippers 499). The word can also be used figuratively to "seal" in the sense of confirm or authenticate (Jn. 3:33; 6:27). In First Corinthians 9:2, Paul used the noun (*sphragis*, $\sigma \varphi \rho \alpha \gamma i \zeta$) to show that the existence of the Corinthian church confirmed the legitimacy of his apostleship (cf. 2 Cor. 3:1-3).

Paul connected "sealing" with the Holy Spirit (2 Cor. 1:22; Eph. 1:13-14). This "sealing" takes place at the moment a person obeys the Gospel (cf. 1 Cor. 6:11; 12:13 [cf. Acts 2:38]). While Ephesians 1:13 relates "being sealed" with or by the Holy Spirit (cf. Eph. 4:30) to the whole conversion event, Second Corinthians 1:21-22 looks on conversion as God's "anointing" converts "in Christ" and associates it with receiving the pledge of the Spirit, which is a down payment guaranteeing the day of redemption (Eph. 1:14; 2 Cor. 1:22). In "sealing" obedient believers with His Spirit, God makes them His own authentic possession. While the Holy Spirit's sealing never violates God's word, the word of God is not said to "seal" Christians.

THE HOLY SPIRIT GUARANTEES

Now He who has prepared us for this very thing is

God, who also has given us the Spirit as a guarantee. (2 Cor. 5:5 cf.

2 Cor. 1:22; Eph. 1:13-14)

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The word translated "guarantee [earnest, KJV; pledge, NAS]" (from arrabon, ἀρραβών) refers to a pledge; guarantee of what is to come; a deposit of money, installment. The word was used as a legal and commercial technical term for first installment, deposit, down payment, pledge, that pays a part of the purchase price in advance, and so secures a legal claim to the article in question, or makes a contract valid ... a payment which obligates the contracting party to make further payments;" thus, Paul is saying that God "has deposited the first installment of the Spirit in our hearts" (Bauer 109). This blessing, coupled with being sealed, is, as it were, a "written guarantee" from God, who cannot lie, that the faithful Christian belongs to Him and will receive all the blessings in Christ, both temporal and eternal. Again, this guarantee would never contradict God's word, but the word of God is not said to be the Christian's down payment guarantee!

While the Holy Spirit and God's word are inseparable, and their work overlaps, they are not the same. We know the Holy Spirit's work and every other spiritual truth the same way, "The Bible tells me so."
